Subject: Census First Release

## Purpose

To provide an outline of the First Topic summary of the Census – Demography and Migration.

## How have Household and resident characteristics Changed?

- In 2021, there were 133,482 households in Doncaster, up 5.5% from 126,487 in 2011. In England and Wales, there were 24.8 million households, up 6.1% from 23.4 million in 2011.
- Of the 308,106 usual residents in Doncaster in 2021, 303,172 (98.4%) lived in households and 4,934 (1.6%) lived in communal establishments. In the Yorkshire and Humber region, there were 98.1% of residents living in households and 1.9% living in communal establishments.
- The average household size in Doncaster in 2021 was 2.3 people per household, this was a slight decrease from 2.4 people per household in 2011; the average for England and Wales was 2.4 residents per household.
- Over half of households in Doncaster (56.2%, 75,088) were deprived in at least one dimension or measure of household deprivation; this number has decreased since 2011, when it was 63.2% (79,936).
- Overall, 64.1% of households (85,499 households) were single family households, 31.2% (41,667) were one person households and 4.7% (6,312) were multiple family or other household types. Within the Yorkshire and Humber region, 63.1% of households were single family households, 31.5% were one person households and 5.4% were other household types.
- Since 2011, the percentage of usual residents aged 16 years and over who were married or in civil partnerships has decreased, from 47.1% in 2011 to 43.6% in 2021. The percentage who were never married and never been in a civil partnership has increased, from 32.2% in 2011 to 36.3% in 2021.

## How have the number of people born outside the UK changed?

- One in ten usual residents of Doncaster were born outside the UK, an increase of 13,447 since 2011, from 18,669 (6.2%) to 32,116 (10.5%). In the Yorkshire and Humber region there has been an increase of 157,567 since 2011, from 464,691 (8.8%) to 622,258 (11.2%). However Doncaster saw the greatest change in South Yorkshire (Doncaster 4.3% Change, Barnsley 3.1% Change, Rotherham 1.7% Change and Sheffield 3.3% Change).
- It is clear that EU8 and EU2 countries are more prominent in Doncaster than what is seen nationally.

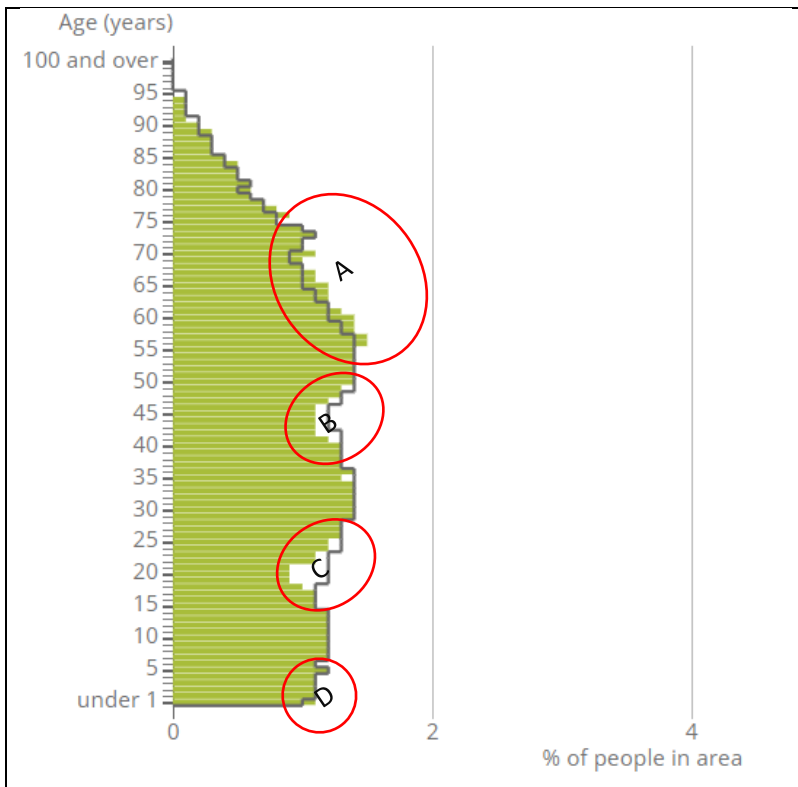
- Poland remained the most common country of birth outside the UK in 2021 (7,182 people, 2.3% of all usual residents). The number of people who were born in Romania grew by 5073% since the previous census, from 116 in 2011 to 6,001 in 2021. This is the highest number of people born in Romania in any LA area in the North of England.

- The population of Doncaster has grown by 1.9% which is below the regional (3.7%) and national (6.6%) growth over the past 10 years
- The population breakdown by ward showing 2011 population and 2021 census information. The Finningley Ward includes the development around the Airport.

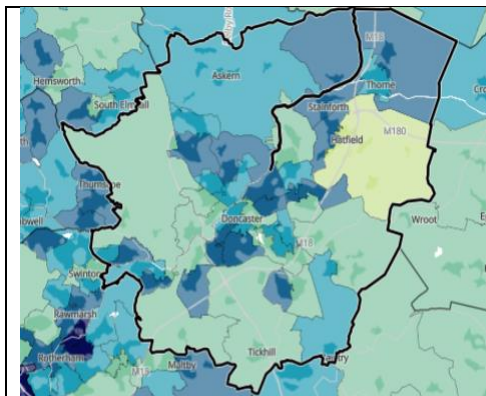
The Population Chart shows the proportion of people in each age segment compared with the national average shown by the Grey line.

A – Generally there are greater proportions of people in Doncaster than nationally at ages 55 to 70.

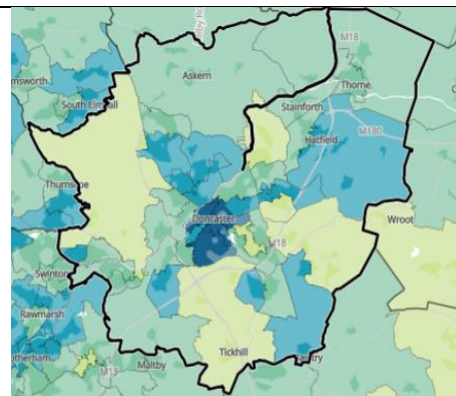
B – There is a slight deficit of people in their early to mid-forties when compared to national averages.

C – There are lower proportions of people in Doncaster in the 18-24 age bracket than found nationally.

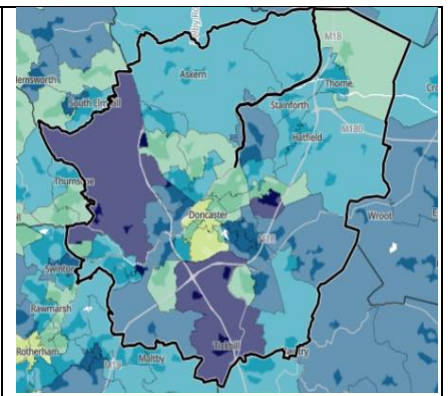
D – Generally younger (<14) ages are very close to the national average but the very youngest 0-2 is slightly higher.



Population 0-15: Generally follows settlement patters and higher proportions in the larger settlements and urban centre.



Population 16-64: Higher proportion in the urban centre and surrounding communities.



Population 65+: Higher proportions in rural and suburb areas

The darker the colour the higher proportion of population.
