Subject: Census First Release

## Purpose

To provide an outline of the First Topic summary of the Census – Economic Activity

## Economic activity status

At Census Day, 21 March 2021, 146,264 usual residents aged 16 years and over in Doncaster were economically active (58.3%), while 104,662 (41.7%) were economically inactive. In Yorkshire and Humber region, 58.6% were economically active and 41.4% economically inactive.

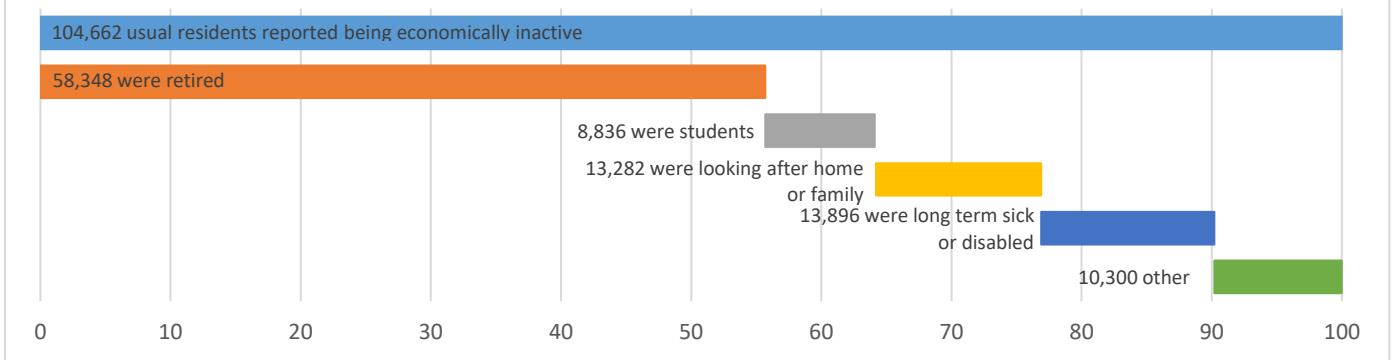
Edenthorpe & Kirk Sandall Ward had the highest percentage of people in employment (59.4%) whereas Stainforth & Barnby Dun had the lowest (48.3%). Town Ward had the lowest percentage of people considered economically inactive (38.1%); Hatfield had the highest percentage of people (48.5%).

Among usual residents aged 16 years and over, almost half were employees (47.3%, 118,783), 7.6% were self-employed (19,076) and a further 3.3% (8,405) were unemployed but looking for work. In Yorkshire and Humber 47.0% were employees, 8.2% were self-employed and 3.4% were unemployed but looking for work.

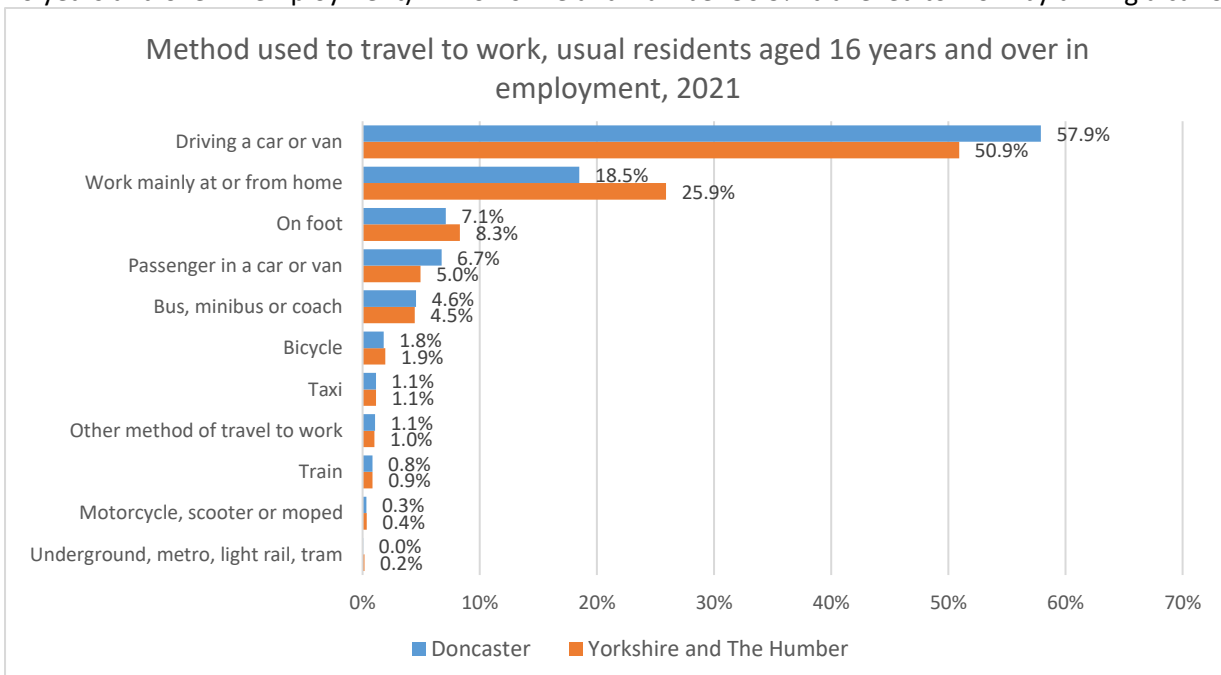
Over a fifth of usual residents aged 16 years and over were economically inactive because of retirement (23.3%, 58,348). In Yorkshire and Humber there were 22.9% economically inactive due to retirement.

### Travel to work

Census 2021 estimates that 25,503 (18.5%) usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment in Doncaster worked mainly at or from home in the week before Census Day, 21 March 2021. In Yorkshire and Humber there were 25.9% worked mainly at or from home. Just over 112,355 usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment (81.5%) gave a method other than “at or from home”. In Yorkshire and Humber 74.2% used another method of travel to work. The most selected mode of travel to work was driving a car or a van (57.9%, 79,823 of all usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment). In Yorkshire and Humber 50.9% travelled to work by driving a car or van.



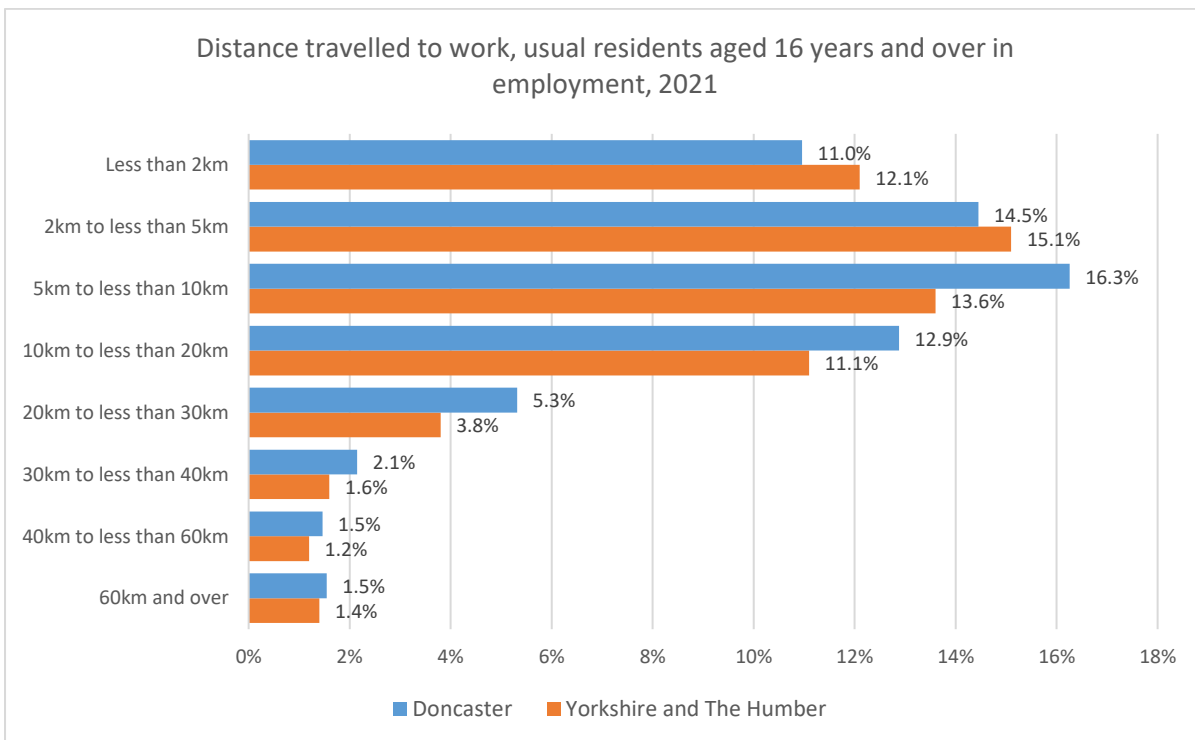
Tickhill & Wadworth Ward has the highest proportion of people (29.3%) who work mainly at or from home, whereas Hexthorpe & Balby North Ward had the lowest proportion using this method, only 11.4%. Norton & Askern Ward has the highest percentage of people who travel to work by driving a car or van (63.3%).

In Doncaster, 89,637 people travelled to a workplace or depot (65.0% of usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment). In addition to the 25,503 people who worked mainly at or from home (18.5%), a further 22,719 people worked mainly at an offshore installation, in no fixed place, or outside the UK (16.5%).

Of those travelling to a workplace or depot, 57,445 people (41.7% of usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment) travelled short distances to work (less than 10 kilometres). 32,192 people (23.4% of usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment) travelled longer distances to work (10 kilometres and over).



**Industry and occupation**

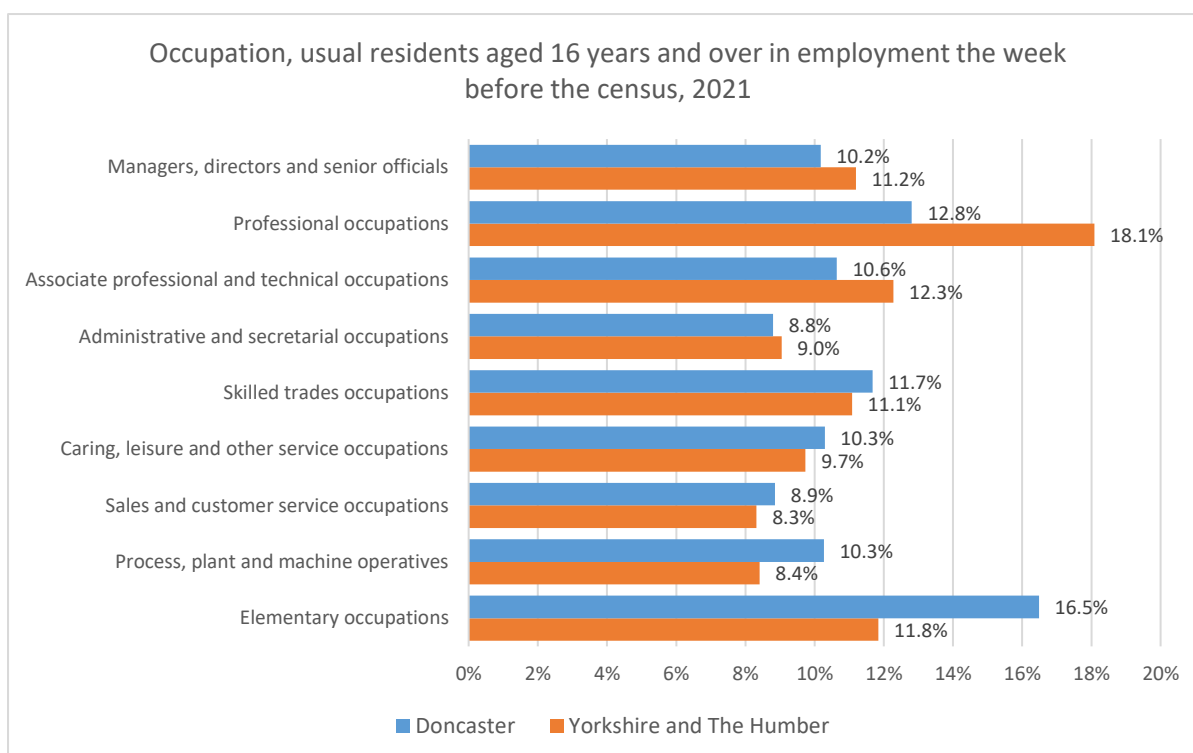
The largest number of usual residents aged 16 years and over in employment the week before Census Day, 21 March 2021, worked within the broad wholesale, retail and motor trade industry (21.1%, 29,090 out of 137,859 in employment). This was also the case in Yorkshire and Humber, 16.7% worked in the wholesale, retail and motor trade industry.

Employment in the manufacturing industry decreased by 1.7 percentage points (9.0%, 12,396 in 2021, compared with 10.7%, 14,254 in 2011), whereas employment in wholesale, retail and motor trade industry increased by 1.7 percentage points (21.1%, 29,090 in 2021, compared with 19.4%, 26,026 in 2011).

In Yorkshire and Humber, employment in the manufacturing industry decreased by 1.8 percentage points, 9.4% in 2021 down from 11.2% in 2011. Employment in human health and social work activities across Yorkshire and Humber increased by 1.99 percentage points, 15.3% in 2021 up from 13.4% in 2011.

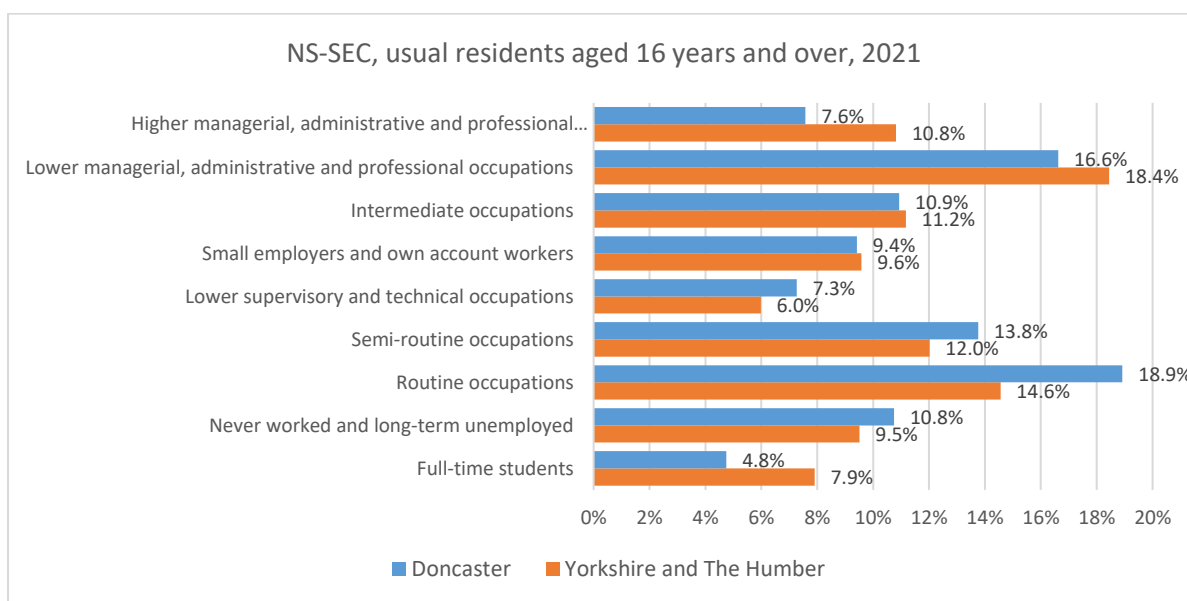
More people were employed in elementary occupations compared with any other broad occupation categories (16.5%, 22,724 people). In Yorkshire and Humber, more people were employed in professional occupations (18.1%).



Town Ward has the highest proportion of workers in a particular occupation, 30.2% working in elementary occupations. Conversely, Hexthorpe & Balby North Ward has the lowest proportion of workers in a particular occupation, 5.6% working as managers, directors and senior officials.

The most common socio-economic classification in Doncaster was routine occupations (18.9% of usual residents aged 16 years and over, 47,485). In Yorkshire and Humber, the most common socio-economic classification was lower managerial, administrative and professional occupations (18.4%).



Hexthorpe & Balby North Ward has the highest proportion of residents in a particular socio-economic classification, 28.8% in routine occupations. Hexthorpe & Balby North also has the lowest proportion, 3.6% in higher managerial, administrative and professional classification.
