### Social Isolation Alliance



#### **Background**

In 2019 the Social Isolation and Loneliness Alliance (SIA) was formally established after Cabinet approval with DMBC.

Following its establishment, Doncaster Culture & Leisure Trust (DCLT) was democratically elected by the members of the Alliance to serve as the lead organisation.

The role of the lead organisation was to support the members within the group to reduce loneliness in Doncaster. This included support with funding applications, group set up, and grant allocation of funds.

In 2020 and in response to COVID, the priorities of the SIA changed, and support focussed on humanitarian aid through the devolvement of foodbank funding. During this time, £49,208 in funding to assist those in need was devolved.

Following this, and to support VCFS organisations further, a robust grant funding model was developed in 2021, along with a panel to adjudicate applications, allowing VCFS organisations to access the following funding streams.

# Funds successfully devolved

**Humanitarian Fund 2020 –2021**£324,645


The fund was specifically designed to support organisations to grow and sustain provisions which tackled inequalities, social exclusion, social isolation and loneliness, and provided humanitarian support to the most vulnerable and the clinically extremely vulnerable in Doncaster during COVID.

Fund 2021 –2022 £45,000 The grant was established to provide support to VCFS organisations to help the clinically extremely vulnerable, who had no existing networks, with practical support during winter 2021/22.

Winter Support Fund 2021 – 2022 £31,641 The fund allowed VCFS organisations to provide practical support to the clinically extremely vulnerable and offer a variety of projects to ensure people reconnect safely after COVID during winter 2021/22.

VCFS Fund 2022 – present £243,156 The SIA's current fund allows organisations to support Doncaster residents through projects designed to tackle social isolation and loneliness as well as funding for Welcome Spaces that support the current cost-of-living crisis.
