

### Stronger Families Quarterly Performance Report Quarter 1 2017-18

#### Headlines

2017 -2018 is the third financial year of the five year Expanded Stronger Families Programme. We have made significant increases in Q4 last year and Q1 this year in families who we are engaged and working with who meet the essential criteria for the Programme. We continue to progress but also continue to struggle to produce the required number of claims for Payment by Results (PbR).

We have a wider spread of families across the spectrum from 'superlight to complex' which means we are reaching a wider range of needs of families. We continue to have a much higher level of single parent households on the programme than the Doncaster Demographic and larger families on average too.


The beginning of this year saw a large amount of turmoil nationally with the Brexit referendum and the subsequent general election and the current issues relating to that result. This report provides an insight into the national programme and this shows that many areas across the country are having similar issues to Doncaster in that they are struggling to convert family progress into claims for PbR. Some places appear to be doing well and so we will look at what we can learn from these areas over the next few months.


We have also seen a series of tragedies too across the country and these all have had an effect on Whitehall and the department that runs the Troubled Families Programme nationally. This means that the post-election direction of the programme nationally is not yet set but we are expecting some changes to be announced to help improve the processes and further align other policy from the Government.

We are aiming to have the **case management** system on EHM implemented by October this year and this will help us record, monitor and track families more efficiently and this should lead to more claims being identified too. This system has, however, been dogged with issues and we are not yet in a position where we can be sure it will be in place on time.


In Doncaster Council the Children' Centres have been re developed and branded as **Family Hubs**, in line with the All Party parliamentary report on the future of Children's Centres. This will allow for a greater range of services for families and set the Hubs up as the 'go to place' for families in their locality. The Family Hubs have a large part to play in Stronger Families and we aim to support them in this role.


All structured family support has now moved to the Children's Trust and the new **Parenting and Family Support (PAFS)** service is up and running. We are working closely with them to improve the number of claims they are providing. Similar work will take place with health partners too so we can extract the required evidence for claims from the work they do with families.







117 Families have improved against Outcome 1 - parents and children involved in crime or antisocial behaviour




75 Families have improved against Outcome 2 - Children who have not been attending school regularly
